## **US History 1 Syllabus/Expectations**

- The Wild West and the Expanding Frontier
- The Industrial Revolution
- Progressivism in the 20th Century
- The Great War/WW1

...These are the broad topics to be covered, but we will dig deeper into many of the intricacies and relate these topics to our current problems in the 21st Century United States.

What to Expect? Expect to see many different perspectives on much of the history you <u>THINK</u> you know! We will explore both sides of many different topics to help us understand what all parties were thinking.
