# Journalism I, II, and III Syllabus: Mrs. Shultz-Room 125

### **Course Description:**

**JOURNALISM I:** Teacher signature required. This is a semester course for students who wish to work on the school newspaper, The Rohistat, or who wish to explore a career in journalism. The course incorporates extensive research skills; investigative reporting; expository, editorial, and journalistic writing skills; the writing process; and problem-solving techniques. Students work as a collaborative team to brainstorm school issues, select articles, create layouts, and market the paper to the school. In addition, photographers and artists who will be on staff are responsible for visual components of the paper.

**JOURNALISM II** – Prerequisite: 85% in Journalism I and teacher approval. Students will continue to master skills essential to newspaper writing, layout and production. This course will enhance the skills developed in Journalism I by emphasizing the editing and publishing of a student publication.

**JOURNALISM III-** Prerequisite: 85% in Journalism II and teacher approval. Students will continue to master skills essential to newspaper writing, layout and production. This course will enhance the skills developed in Journalism II by emphasizing the editing and publishing of a student publication.

## Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Recognize, analyze, an interpret media literacy works.
  - 2. Read and respond to media through argumentative, expository, and analytical formats.
  - 3. Write and speak with command of standard English conventions using critical thinking.
- 4. Write in a variety of different genres with a clear focus, purpose, and logical organization.
- 5. Prepare for professional careers or high education through mock Journalism practice.

### Major Assignments:

A variety of activities and assignments will be completed throughout this course. Due dates will be provided as activities are assigned to students. Course content will consist of the following:

- Writing: Practice exercises, bell ringers, and various longer writing assignments focusing on informative, narrative, explanatory, and argumentative pieces

- Literature: Reading will be done both inside and outside of class. Class discussions, activities, written responses, and tests will also be included in course content. Selections will focus on various modes of media literacy and employment relevant literary works.
- **Employment:** Career oriented application focusing on how to interpret media literacy and develop skills in public and live journalism.

#### **Grading:**

Students will complete both formal and informal assessments throughout the duration of the course. Assessments will include but are not limited to quizzes/tests, essays, presentations, creative projects, homework, class activities, participation, and bell ringers. Grading for the course will be based on points accumulated from these assessments according to the Rockwood Area School District grading scale.

## Mrs. Shultz' Classroom Rules and Expectations:

- Bring all necessary materials to class every day. This includes a writing utensil, your planner, notes/handouts, a charged Chromebook, your binder/folder, and reading materials.

- Food is not permitted in the classroom (unless given special permission by the teacher).
- Students will not open windows, move classroom objects, or touch items on the teacher's desk.
- Students will remain seated until dismissed by the teacher. Students are not permitted to gather by the door or move around the classroom while waiting for dismissal.
- Students will be respectful to the teacher, classmates, and all classroom objects/supplies.

#### Plagiarism and Cheating:

Plagiarism and cheating will not be tolerated. Plagiarism refers to claiming someone else's words, thoughts, or ideas as your own. This could refer to a classmate or information taken from the Internet. **This also includes any AI generated content**. Any work copied from someone or somewhere else will not be accepted and will result in a 0 for both you and the individual whose work you copied. Any work completed using AI technology will not be accepted. All assignments are subject to be checked for authenticity using anti-plagiarism software, such as Turnitin. Furthermore, handwritten assignments must be completed in your own handwriting unless previously approved by the teacher. Assignments that are re-submitted from other classes or other students will receive a zero.
